11. What is the Artboard in Illustrator?

An **Artboard** is the working area where you create and arrange your design. You can have multiple artboards within a single document to work on different parts of a project.

12. How do you save a file for print in Illustrator?

To save for print, use **File > Save As** and choose the **PDF** or **EPS** format. Ensure the color mode is set to CMYK and the resolution is high (300 DPI).
